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First of all I would like to take this opportunity to introduce myself to you. I am Police Sergeant Rencher from the Aston And Newtown Neighbourhood Team. My team and I are responsible for the policing of Aston And Newtown and the safety for the residents of these two areas.

The purpose of this letter is to remind all of you that we are still in the middle of the Covid outbreak and the numbers of cases are rising significantly around the country, Birmingham itself is currently in the spotlight due to the rise of infections within the city.

It has been brought to my attention that some of the parents from Chilwell Croft Academy are gathering together at drop off or pick up times which is likely to increase the risk of infection of Covid 19. It would only take one parent to have been infected and not yet have shown any symptoms for the infection to spread amongst you all, and possibly to your children.

I would urge you to take precautions whilst at pick up and drop off times by ensuring you wear a mask and observe social distancing, you should remain two metres apart and if this is not possible at least one metre apart to reduce the risk of spreading this illness.

Your headteacher Mr Murphy and my priority is the safety of your children and to help the school to remain open for a prolonged period. The current actions of a few could put this in jeopardy.

Please think hard when you pick up or drop off your children about the possible consequence of your actions.

Thank you for your time I have included a list of what I think are the most important regulations to follow to limit the spread of the disease and keep you and your children safe.

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1. You should stay 2 metres away from other people, wash your hands often, not touch your face and catch coughs and sneezes in a tissue. These actions are critical to reducing the transmission of COVID-19 in our communities.

2. If you have symptoms of COVID-19, you should stay at home and book a free test immediately. Closely follow the advice you are given when you book your test. If you live with other people, they should stay at home too.

3. If you are notified by NHS Test and Trace that you are a contact of a person with COVID-19, stay at home and follow the advice you are given.

4. If you are returning from certain countries affected by COVID-19, stay at home and follow the advice you are given.

5. If you are staying at home for any COVID-19 related reason, you should not go outside except to your own garden or outside space. You should not have visitors to your home except for people who provide you with essential care.

6. Wear a face covering on public transport, in shops and supermarkets, and all other public places where you are required to do so by law.
